

OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
AUGUST 1, 2005

CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Herb Hartle, on Tuesday, August 17, 2005 7:30 p.m. at the Ohio Township Municipal Building.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Hartle asked the secretary to note the presence of the three supervisors, Herb Hartle, Jim Reid and George Wible.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – There was no comments from the citizens.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Mr. Hartle announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. There being no corrections, Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Mr. Sullivan read the treasurer's report. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, to approve the treasurer's report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT – Mr. Sullivan read the total invoices due for payment in the amount of \$258,793.69 which covers check #2854 to #3044. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, approving the invoices as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY – Chief Micklos submitted the police activity for the month of July 2005 as follows: Officers were called to the Get Go Gas station to investigate a possible assault between two individuals waiting to get gas. Officers were investigating a report that an Ohio Township resident was receiving threatening phone calls over his cell phone. Officers were called to the Giant Eagle to investigate a theft of a wallet from a shopping cart. The victim stated that she was distracted by a female customer as her wallet was removed from her purse. Officers were called to the Home Depot for a theft report. The individual was not cooperating with store officials until officers arrived. Officers were called to the Avonworth Elementary School for a destruction of property report. Local youth have been riding bicycles and skateboards and causing damage to the playground. The youth involved have been told not to return to the playground. The pesticide was supplied by Allegheny County and a single pesticide pouch was applied manually into each catch basin.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Mr. Reid reported paving on Crawford has been completed. Mr. Reid stated that the installation of the new playground equipment is now underway at the park.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS – There was no unfinished business to come before the Board this month.

NEW BUSINESS – Mr. Hartle stated we have for consideration final site plan for Triumph Baptist Church for approval. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, to approve final site plan for Triumph Baptist Church. The motion was carried unanimously. Mr. Hartle stated we have for consideration final site plan for Mt. Nebo Point Sub-Division for approval. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle, to approve final site plan for Mt. Nebo Point Sub-Division. The motion passed 2 – 1 in favor with Mr. Wible casting the negative vote. Mr. Hartle stated we have for Resolution 18-05 for consideration. This is a resolution accepting ownership and maintenance responsibilities for a portion of service road “A” from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, to accept ownership and maintenance for a portion of service road “A”

SOLICITOR'S REPORT – There was no Solicitor's Report for the month of July.

CORRESPONDENCE – We had no correspondence to the month of July.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business, Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wible, to adjourn the meeting. The motion was carried unanimously.
