

TOWNSHIP OF OHIO
ORDINANCE NO. 246

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF OHIO, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING SECTION 107-5 (B) OF ORDINANCE NO. 173, ADOPTED MAY 11, 1992, ESTABLISHING MANDATORY PARTICIPATION FOR THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE, RUBBISH, WASTE AND OTHER MATERIALS FROM INDIVIDUAL RESIDENTS AND MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL SOURCES WITH FOUR OR LESS UNITS.

WHEREAS, the Township of Ohio did on or about the 11th day of May, 1992, by Ordinance No. 173, which Ordinance provided for the prohibition of accumulation, burning, garbage and other refuse materials, provided for the collection of garbage, refuse, rubbish and all other matters, and in Section 107-5 (B), provided for the manner of payment for the collection and charges for garbage removal; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Ohio is desirous of imposing mandatory participation for individual and multi-family units in the removal of solid waste from the Township of Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, and it is hereby ordained as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 107-5 of Ordinance No. 173, adopted the 11th day of May, 1992, is hereby amended as follows:

"All households and homeowners shall utilize the residential collection service provided by the municipality.

In the event that a property owner shall not pay the garbage fee removal assessment billed to such property owner by the collector responsible for solid waste removal, in addition to the violations and penalties set forth in Section 107-9 of the Ordinance, the Township may place a lien against said property for said services in accordance with the procedures for the filing of municipal claims with the Prothonotary of Allegheny County. All costs associated with the filing of such liens, including attorney's fees, shall be the responsibility of the property owner".


