

OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
April 6, 2026

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CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Cesar Cenicerros, on Monday, April 6, 2026 at the Ohio Township Municipal Park.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Cesar Cenicerros asked the secretary to note the presence of supervisors Cesar Cenicerros and Brian Krul. It is noted that Township Manager Justin Klingenberg and Township Clerk Amber Zwierzynski were also in attendance.

CORRESPONDENCE – The Board is in receipt of the 2025 Municipal Audit.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS –

Residents from the Sewickley Ridge Community, Doug Vandervort (108 Old Glory Lane), Steve Helm (129 Presidents Drive), and Tom Limberis (236 Independence Way). These residents addressed the Board in regard to the increase in property tax millage and the implementation of the fire tax for 2026.

Township Manager, Justin Klingenberg, and Supervisors Cesar Cenicerros and Brian Krul responded to the citizens' questions and concerns in regard to the increase in millage for 2026.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Cesar Cenicerros announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Brian Krul made a motion, seconded by Cesar Cenicerros to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Mr. Klingenberg read the treasurer's report for the month of March. Brian Krul made a motion, seconded by Cesar Cenicerros to approve the treasurer's report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT – Mr. Klingenberg read the total invoices due for payment are \$368,211.57 which covers checks #38321 to #38413 (PNC Bank), an EFTs in the amount of \$1,485.00 \$884.81 (State Fund) and check #1187 in the amount of \$5,386.20 and checks #1421 and #1422 in the amount of \$2,642.94 (DEA Fund). Brian Krul made a motion, seconded by Cesar Cenicerros approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY – The police summary for the month of February is as follows: The Ohio Twp Police Department responded to 276 calls. 22 Alarms, 38 Traffic Related, 35 Utility/Road Hazard/Wires Down, 71 Medical Emergency/ Assistance Calls, 13 Theft/Stolen Property, 9 Suspicious Vehicle/Persons/Incidents, 10 animal complaints, 10 Disorderly Conduct/Civil Dispute/Criminal Mischief, 11 welfare check/mental health, 1 DUI, 2 road department callouts, 5 Property Damage/Ordinance Violations, and 24 miscellaneous calls.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT –

Public Works was busy during the month of March due to multiple weather systems that came through our area. To clear the trees and open roads as soon as possible.

The winter season gave us one last snowstorm on March 17th. The public works crew was out after hours, plowing and salting to keep the roads clear.

As we enter into spring, it is time for the plows and spreaders to come off the trucks so that road repairs can begin. Public Works has been patching potholes and fixing plow damage.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of our skilled public works crew, Ohio Townships' new salt storage facility has been completed and is currently being stocked with salt for next winter.

Paving on Duff Road is on the top of the list of projects and hopefully it will commence next month.
