

**OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
February 2, 2026**

CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Cesar Cenicerros, on Monday, February 2, 2026 at the Ohio Township Municipal Park.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Cesar Cenicerros asked the secretary to note the presence of supervisors Cesar Cenicerros and Brian Krul. It is noted that Township Manager Justin Klingenberg and Township Clerk Amber Zwierzynski were also in attendance.

CORRESPONDENCE – We are in receipt of a resignation letter from Robert Huffmyer from the Board of Supervisors and it will be placed on the March Agenda.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – None

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Cesar Cenicerros announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Cesar Cenicerros made a motion, seconded by Brian Krul, to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT – Mr. Klingenberg read the treasurer’s report for the month of January. Brian Krul made a motion, seconded by Cesar Cenicerros to approve the treasurer’s report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT – Mr. Klingenberg read the total invoices due for payment are \$313,252.63 which covers checks #38191 to #38262 (PNC Bank), check #1419 - #1420 in the amount of \$1,065.94 (DEA Account) and EFTs in the amount of \$24,691.12 (State Fund). Brian Krul made a motion, seconded by Cesar Cenicerros approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY – The police summary for the month of January is as follows: The Ohio Twp Police Department responded to 270 calls. 31 Alarms, 13 Disabled Vehicles, 23 Traffic Accidents, 66 Medical Emergency/ Assistance Calls, 12 parking complaints, 3 trespassing reports, 3 domestic disturbances, 30 Traffic Citation, 13 animal complaints, 7 suspicious person/ circumstances/autos, 2 welfare check/mental health, 12 harassment call, 9 road department callouts, 18 fraud/theft, and 26 miscellaneous calls.

MANAGER'S REPORT –

The municipal building will be closed on Monday, February 16, 2026 in observance of President's Day.

We have received a grant award in the amount of \$330,000.00 for the EMS & Fire Training Facility Storm Water Improvements from the PA Small Water & Sewer Program.

We have exercised our first-year extension with Wright Asphalt and Concrete LLC for milling and disposal of bituminous pavement materials. We expect to mill approximately 14,083 yards of Duff Road beginning in May.

We are in receipt of a resignation letter from Robert Huffmyer from his position of Chairman of the Board of Supervisors.

The new Chipotle has opened in the Township. We are working to reconfigure the intersection to include a left turn lane.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT –

With snow and low temperatures, the public works department has been busy keeping the roads clear in January. The crew was called out five (5) times in the past month. During the most recent storm on January 25th, the crew worked in shifts for over 22 hours straight to keep the roads open.

Despite the extreme cold and snow, progress has continued on the new salt shed roof. The main roof structure has been erected. As the weather allows, we will continue constructing end walls and fastening down the roof panels.
