

OHIO TOWNSHIP SANITARY AUTHORITY
MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 4, 2021 REGULAR MEETING

The Chairman called the Regular Meeting of the Ohio Township Sanitary Authority to order at the Ohio Township Municipal Building at 6:00 p.m. It needs to be noted that due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Board members attended the meeting via conference call along with Township Solicitor Matt Kalina. Present were: Denny Coyle, Jeff Ciaramella, Herb Hartle, John Sullivan, Rob Trombold, Pat Cannon and Doug Evans.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – None.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Mr. Sullivan made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ciaramella approving the January meeting minutes as posted. The motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT & INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT – Mr. Ciaramella made a motion, seconded by Mr. Sullivan, approving the January Treasurer’s Report and regular invoices due for payment in the amount of \$389,678.39. The motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS – None. Mr. Sullivan reported that he had received a call from the police that a manhole at Bear Run Apartments was backed up. John contacted Justin Klingenberg, Public Works Director who contacted MTSA to send a crew over to investigate the back up. A report of what was discovered will be forwarded.

NEW BUSINESS – Mr. Coyle stated we have the Developer’s Agreement for Phase 4 of Sewickley Crossing for consideration. Mr. Trombold made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle to approve the Phase 4 Developer’s Agreement for Sewickley Crossing. The motion carried.

SOLICITOR’S REPORT – Matt Kalina stated he is working with LuAnn Barna and John Sullivan to clear up delinquent property liens the sanitary authority has on the books.
