

OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
June 3, 2019

CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman, Tom Beatty, on Monday, June 3, 2019 at the Ohio Township Municipal Building.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Beatty asked the secretary to note the presence of supervisors, Jim Reid, Herb Hartle and Tom Beatty.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – none.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Mr. Beatty announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle, to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT – Mr. Sullivan read the treasurer’s report for the month of May. Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid, to approve the treasurer’s report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT - Mr. Sullivan read the total invoices due for payment are \$858,794.77 which covers checks #27885 to #28037 (PNC Bank), Checks #1318 for the total of \$775.00 (DEA) and Check #1093 for the total of \$11,489.95 (State Fund). Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY –The police summary for the month of May is as follows: The Ohio Township Police Department responded to 235 calls. 30 Alarms, 1 Disabled Vehicle, 10 Thefts/Theft Reports, 4 false fire alarms, 2 motor vehicle accidents, 2 Traffic Accidents, 20 Medical Emergency/ Assistance Calls, 71 Traffic Citations, 7 Traffic & Parking Problems, 1 domestic disturbance, 3 suspicious person/ circumstances/autos, 10 assist other agencies, 1 welfare check, 6 warnings, 4 building/auto lockouts and 63 Miscellaneous Calls.

FIRE REPORT – The emergency and fire report for the month of May is as follows: The Ohio Township Fire Department responded to 30 calls. 3 Vehicle Crashes, 9 fire alarms, 1 brush fire, 1 containment, 1 vehicle fire, 5 RIT responses, 3 EMS assist calls and 7 reports of trees/wires down.

MS4 Report – Joe Jackson reported he has started the stormwater maintenance on storm sewer system and he has finished the annual catch basin inspections on all township owned roads and facilities.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Justin Klingenberg reported the road department has been working on the landscape at the municipal building and the park, the flagpole work at the softball field on Nicholson Road is nearly complete, and work on Crawford Road stream bank stabilization is almost complete and the road paving will begin soon.

PUBLIC HEARING – Mr. Beatty opened the public hearing to discuss proposed ordinance #331, which amends Ordinance #305: to allow single family dwellings as a conditional use in the C-1 limited commercial district and to amend the current term “mini-warehouse or self-storage facility” by separating it into two separate uses, (1) mini warehouse and (2) self storage facility and to amend the uses table to allow self storage facilities as a permitted use by right in the C-1 limited commercial and C-2 general commercial zoning districts.

There were no comments from the public. Mr. Beatty closed the public hearing.

NEW BUSINESS – Mr. Beatty stated we have Ordinance #331 for consideration. **Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle to approve Ordinance #331. The motion carried.**

Mr. Beatty stated we have the Wireless Ordinance Amendments and Design Guidelines Proposal from Cohen Law Group for consideration. **Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle to accept the proposal from Cohen Law Group. The motion carried.**

Mr. Beatty stated we have the two lot line revision for 147/151 Buckingham Drive in the Cobblestone Plan for consideration. **Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid to approve the two-lot line revision. The motion carried.**

SOLICITORS REPORT – None.

CORRESPONDENCE – None.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business, Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid to adjourn the meeting. The motion was carried unanimously.
