

**OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
REGULAR MEETING  
March 2, 2015**

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**CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER** – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman, Tom Beatty, on Monday, March 2, 2015 at the Ohio Township Municipal Building.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Beatty asked the secretary to note the presence of all three supervisors, Herb Hartle, Jim Reid and Tom Beatty.

**COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS** – None.

**INTRODUCTION OF NEW FULL-TIME OFFICER** – Chief Micklos introduced the newest full-time officer Dominic DeJulio. Dominic was hired in 2010 as a part-time officer and maintained that position until February 5<sup>th</sup> when he became fulltime.

**APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES** – Mr. Beatty announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid, to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

**TREASURER’S REPORT** – Mr. Sullivan read the treasurer’s report for the month of February. Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid, to approve the treasurer’s report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

**INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT** - Mr. Sullivan read the total invoices due for payment are \$211,847.83 which covers checks #20302 to #20457 (PNC Bank), Checks #1244 to #1246 for the total of \$2,170.81 (DEA) and Check #1058 in the amount of \$26,314.26 (State Fund). Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

**POLICE SUMMARY** –The police summary for the month of February is as follows: The Ohio Township Police Department responded to 211 calls. 23 Alarms, 2 Disabled Vehicles, 2 Theft Reports, 5 Fires (including alarms founded/unfounded), 4 motor vehicle accidents, 2 Suspicious Circumstances, 4 Animal Complaints, 17 Traffic Accidents, 24 Medical Emergency/Assistance Calls, 18 Traffic Citations, 3 Lockouts (Vehicle/Bldg), 5 Traffic & Parking Problems, 12 road department call outs, 29 foot patrols, 1 welfare check, 2 suspicious persons, and 58 Miscellaneous Calls.

**FIRE REPORT** - Chief Frazier submitted the emergency and fire report for the month of February as follows: The Ohio Township Fire Department responded to 21 calls. 11 Vehicle Crashes, 5 Fire Alarms, 1 Structure Fire, 1 elevator rescue, 1 Carbon Monoxide Alarm, 1 natural gas odor and 1 water condition.

**PLANNING COMMISSION** – The minutes of the February Planning Commission meeting are incomplete at this time.

**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT** –The Allegheny League of Municipalities has informed us that Ohio Township has been designated as a 2015 Allegheny County Banner Community. Ohio Township has distinguished itself as a municipality who has implemented Benchmark Good Governing Practices as a leader in delivering services and strengthening the quality of life for our constituents. A formal announcement will made at a press conference to be held by County Executive Rich Fitzgerald at the Allegheny County Courthouse in April. At that time the Township will be presented with a Banner Community Designation Certificate by Executive Fitzgerald.

The Banner Communities will also be recognized at the 42nd ALOM Spring Conference in April.

**MANAGER'S REPORT** – The municipal office will be closed on Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> in observance of the Good Friday holiday.

**PUBLIC WORKS REPORT** – Mr. Reid noted the road department continues with snow removal.

**RECREATION REPORT** – Andy Rubino reported completed rentals for February – 0. Park rentals for March – 5. Recreation Alliance of North Pittsburgh (RANP) winter family special needs day was cancelled due to weather and will not be rescheduled. Yoga class started Monday February 23 with 4 participants. Zumba started Wednesday February 25<sup>th</sup> with 3 participants. A Saturday morning yoga session will start on March 14<sup>th</sup> with 5 classes each Saturday.

There are two painting classes scheduled for March. A Wine and Canvas will take place on Friday March 6<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm. A Cookies and Canvas class is scheduled for Tuesday March 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. Children ages 5 and up are welcome. All painting supplies will be provided.

The annual egg hunt will take place on Friday March 20<sup>th</sup> from 8-10 pm for teens and on Saturday March 21<sup>st</sup> at 10 am for kids ages 7 and under. The cost is \$5 resident and \$6 non-resident.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS** – None.

**NEW BUSINESS** – Mr. Beatty stated we have the Mt. Nebo Pointe Sheetz Sub-division for consideration. **Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid to approve the Sheetz Sub-division. The motion was carried unanimously.**

**SOLICITORS REPORT** – Mr. Witherel reported he is in receipt of a 2015 property tax appeal for the Sheetz located at Mt. Nebo and Red Mud Hollow.

**CORRESPONDENCE** – None.

**ADJOURNMENT** – There being no further business, Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Reid to adjourn the meeting. The motion was carried unanimously.
