

OHIO TOWNSHIP SANITARY AUTHORITY  
MINUTES FROM THE MAY 2, 2024 REGULAR MEETING

The Chairman called the Regular Meeting of the Ohio Township Sanitary Authority to order at the Ohio Township Municipal Park at 5:00 p.m. Present were: Denny Coyle, Herb Hartle, John Sullivan, LuAnn Barna, Mike Basista, Justin Klingenberg and Pat Cannon. Engineer Doug Evans and Solicitor Mike Witherel were also in attendance.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – none.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Mr. Sullivan made a motion, seconded by Ms. Barna approving the April meeting minutes as posted. The motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT & INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT – Ms. Barna made a motion, seconded by Mr. Basista approving the April Treasurer’s Report and regular invoices due for payment in the amount of \$439,966.64. The motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS – None.

NEW BUSINESS – None.

ENGINEER’S REPORT –

The public sewer connection at a manhole near the Sheetz (79 & Mt. Nebo) has become deformed and requires excavation and repair. Due to the depth and access road restoration, may require public bidding.

Engineer is prepared to provide design for sewer replacement at LeGrogan Road.

664 Duff Road – Outstanding punchlist items which prevent acceptance by the Authority remain. Additionally, we will be working on As-Builts and easements.

The Reserve at Sewickley Hills – project has addressed technical items. We expect to provide Developer’s Agreement after sewer construction cost is approved.

Nicholson Road Ballfield – maintenance bond inspection has been completed. Several punchlist items were identified.

A resident contacted the Engineer to discuss the installation of a fence on his Duff Road property that would encroach onto the sanitary sewer line. The engineer was directed to have the property owner contact the sanitary office to discuss.

SOLICITOR’S REPORT – See attached report. Ohio Township VFD presented a list of equipment that they are in the process of collecting pricing. This equipment would be useful in the event of an emergency in a deep trench rescue. Sanitary sewer lines are generally buried very deep, and this equipment would allow the first responders to work

in the deep trench. Mr. Witherel will look into the Authorities Act for confirmation that the Authority can assist OTVFD with the purchase of the equipment.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Hartle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Basista, adjourning the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 5:32 P.M. The next monthly meeting will be June 6, 2024.
