

**OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
November 5, 2012**

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CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman, Tom Beatty, on Monday, November 5, 2012 at the Ohio Township Municipal Building.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Beatty asked the secretary to note the presence of two supervisors, Jim Reid and Tom Beatty. Hr. Hartle was absent.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – Kevin Creagh, 1600 Robin Court spoke about traffic concerns he has for the Mt. Nebo corridor with the influx of new commercial and residential development.

BID OPENING – Bids accepted for the 1995 White GMC Truck Tractor. Mr. Witherel opened the only bid received, which was submitted by J.P. Intermodels Inc. out of Wall, PA. They submitted a bid price of \$5,501.00 with a certified check in the amount of \$550.10. Mr. Witherel stated the bid is complete. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Beatty to accept the bid from J.P. Intermodels. The motion was carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Mr. Beatty announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Beatty, to approve the minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT – Mr. Sullivan read the treasurer’s report for the month of November. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Beatty, to approve the treasurer’s report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT - Mr. Sullivan read the total invoices due for payment are \$306,717.62 which covers checks #16276 to #16423 (PNC Bank), Checks #1107 to #1110 for the total of \$2,150.97 (DEA). Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Beatty approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY –The police summary for the month of October is as follows: The Ohio Township Police Department responded to 196 calls. 20 Alarms, 4 Disabled Vehicles, 2 Domestic Disturbances, 5 Theft Reports, 6 Fires (including alarms founded/unfound), 4 motor vehicle accidents, 6 Suspicious Circumstances, 7 Animal Complaints, 12 Traffic Accidents, 16 Medical Emergency/Assistance Calls, 40 Traffic Citations, 3 Lockouts (Vehicle/Bldg), 2 Traffic & Parking Problems, 5 Harassment, 7 Criminal Mischief, and 57 Miscellaneous Calls.

FIRE REPORT - Chief Frazier submitted the emergency and fire report for the month of October as follows: The Ohio Township Fire Department responded to 30 calls. 21 Vehicle Crashes, 5 Fire Alarms, 1 Structure Fire, 1 Tree Down, 1 Natural Gas Odor, and 1 Carbon Monoxide Report.

PLANNING COMMISSION – The minutes of the October Planning Commission are posted on the bulletin board.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT – The Allegheny Health Department is providing the shingles vaccine free of charge for a limited time to people age 60 and older that are uninsured, have private insurance with no vaccine coverage or have Medicare without Part D.

The vaccine is available while supplies last at the County Health Department’s vaccination clinic at 3441 Forbes Avenue in Oakland. The clinic is open Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, & Fridays from 9 am – 4

pm. and Wednesdays from 1 – 8 pm. Free parking is available after 4:30 pm in the lot behind 3333 Forbes Avenue. No appointment is necessary.

Avonworth School District is inviting Senior Citizens in the district to a theatre in the round dress rehearsal of the comedy “Moon Over Buffalo” at 4:30 pm on November 13, 2012. Reservations must be made in advance by November 9th by calling (412) 369-8738 x-1504. A light meal will be provided at intermission.

You may also bring them with you on Election Day. The PA Game Commission Hunter’s Safety program was held on October 5th and 6th and there were 48 students in attendance. Free Health Screening will take place on Thursday, November 8th at 10:00 am. Preschool Arts and Crafts will be held on November 15th at 1 p.m. Haunted Trail went well with 400 people in attendance. Family movie night will be held on November 9th at 7:00 pm and the movie will be The Lorex.
