ORDINANCE NO. 90

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING AN INCREASE IN THE INDEBTEDNESS OF OHIO TOWNSHIP IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND (\$110,000.00) DOLLARS BY ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE AUTHORITY FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN MUNICIPALITIES OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF BORROWING SAID FUNDS WITHOUT INTEREST FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING TEMPORARY INDEBTEDNESS NOTE NO. 2 OF 1969 IN THE PRESENT PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF SIXTY THOUSAND (\$60,000.00) DOLLARS PAYABLE TO MELLON NATIONAL BANK AND TRUST COMPANY AND TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO MEET ADDITIONAL EXPENSES IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION AND FURTHER PLANING OF A PUBLIC SANITARY SEWER IN THE BEAR RUN DRAINAGE AREA OF THE TOWNSHIP, AND LEVYING AN ANNUAL TAX TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPAYMENT OF THE SAME.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the indebtedness of the Township of Ohio, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania be increased by the amount of One Hundred Ten Thousand (\$110,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of paying Temporary Indebtedness Note No. 2 of 1969 in the principal amount of Sixty Thousand (\$60,000.00) Dollars payable to Mellon National Bank & Trust Company borrowed for the purpose of construction of a public sanitary sewer in the Bear Run Drainage Area of said Township, and further to provide funds to meet additional costs and expenses of said project and to provide for further planning to extend said sewer in said drainage area of the Township,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Ohio Township, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

1. That the indebtedness of the Township of Ohio be and is hereby increased by the amount of One Hundred Ten Thousand (\$110,000.00) Dollars for the purposes hereinabove recited.
2. That the indebtedness shall be evidenced and secured by an Agreement to be entered into between the Township of Ohio and the Authority for Improvements in Municipalities of Allegheny County, a municipal authority formed under the Municipality Authority's Act of 1945 (Act of May 2, 1945 P.L. 382) payable no later than five (5) years from date of said Agreement without interest in accordance with the following schedule:
  - (a) First installment of \$22,000.00 on or before October 1, 1971; and
  - (b) \$22,000.00 on or before October 1, 1972; and
  - (c) \$22,000.00 on or before October 1, 1973; and
  - (d) \$22,000.00 on or before October 1, 1974; and
  - (e) \$22,000.00 on or before October 1, 1975.
3. The aforesaid Temporary Indebtedness evidenced by said Agreement is hereby declared to be a general obligation of the Township of Ohio to which it pledges its full faith and credit.
4. The aforesaid Agreement shall be executed in the name and under the corporate seal of the Township of Ohio

by the Chairman of the Board of Township Supervisors, attested by its secretary, and the treasurer of the Township is hereby authorized to deliver said Agreement to the Authority for Improvements in Municipalities of Allegheny County and to receive payment therefor on behalf of the Township.

5. There is hereby levied and assessed upon all persons and property subject to tax within the Township of Ohio, an annual tax in each of the following fiscal years in such amount as will yield sufficient funds for the payment from time to time of the installment payments of principal and of interest to be paid in accordance with the repayment schedule set forth in paragraph 2. above.

6. It is hereby declared that the debt to be incurred hereby together with the existing net debt of the Township is not in excess of any Constitutional or Statutory Limitation; and the Chairman or the Vice-Chairman of the Board of Supervisors and its Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to prepare, verify and file with the Department of Community Affairs in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania the Statement required by the Act of Assembly in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania approved June 25, 1941, P. L. 159, as Supplemented and Amended, and to do and perform all other acts proper in connection therewith.

7. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.




