

**OHIO TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
September 5, 2018**

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CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER – The regular monthly meeting of the Ohio Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman, Tom Beatty, on Wednesday, September 5, 2018 at the Ohio Township Municipal Building, 1719 Roosevelt Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15237.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Beatty asked the secretary to note the presence of supervisors, Jim Reid, Herb Hartle and Tom Beatty.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS – None.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – Mr. Beatty announced that the minutes were posted on the bulletin board. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle, to approve the regular meeting minutes as posted. The motion was carried unanimously.

TREASURER’S REPORT – Mr. Sullivan read the treasurer’s report for the month of August. Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle, to approve the treasurer’s report as read. The motion was carried unanimously.

INVOICES DUE FOR PAYMENT - Mr. Sullivan read the total invoices due for payment are \$431,988.34 which covers checks #26631 to #26773 (PNC Bank); Check #1048 for the total of \$119.00 (Dare Fund) and Check #1307 for the total of \$620.00 (DEA Fund). Mr. Reid made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartle approving the invoices due for payment. The motion was carried unanimously.

POLICE SUMMARY –The police summary for the month of August is as follows: The Ohio Township Police Department responded to 233 calls. 20 Alarms, 8 Disabled Vehicles, 13 Thefts/Theft Reports, 4 motor vehicle accidents, 6 Traffic Accidents, 27 Medical Emergency/Assistance Calls, 27 Traffic Citations, 7 animal complaints, 5 Protection From Abuse (PFA), 4 foot patrols, 15 traffic related issues, 4 welfare checks, 5 vehicle/building lockouts, 4 suspicious person/ circumstances/autos, 7 assist other agencies, 1 ordinance violation – soliciting; abandoned vehicles, 4 disorderly conducts, 7 fires (including alarms founded/unfounded), and 65 Miscellaneous Calls. Chief Hanny reported that there has been a few reports of car break-ins and reminds residents to be vigilant in keeping cars locked overnight. Chief Hanny also introduced Officer Dave Rose as our newest fulltime police officer. Officer Rose has been with the township since 2011. Congratulations to Officer Rose on your promotion.

FIRE REPORT – Chief Penfield submitted the emergency and fire report for the month of August as follows: The Ohio Township Fire Department responded to 27 calls. 10 Vehicle Crashes, 7 fire alarms, 1 brush fire, 1 containment, 1 motorcycle crash, 2 trees down, and 5 structure fires.

MS4 Report – Joe Jackson reported he continues to perform regular inspections of E & S controls, review of small developments for stormwater control, documenting and responding to stormwater related complaints and storm sewer and detention pond maintenance pursuant to Minimum Control Measures 5 and 6. He assisted the Parks and Recreation Department, Avonworth and Eden Christian Academy Varsity Cross Country teams with annual trail clean-up at the Ohio Township Community Park.

PLANNING COMMISSION – The minutes of the May Planning Commission meeting are posted on the bulletin board.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT – The Ohio Township Volunteer Fire Company held its 18th Annual Golf Outing yesterday. It was a HOT one!!! 98 golfers participated in the event which was held at Diamond Run. Dinner followed at the Mayernik Center in Avonworth Community Park. It was one of the best attended and most successful events of the past several years!!!! The silent auction this year was second to none due to the generosity of our new residents in Summer Seat. They provided 7 beautiful themed gift
